Hence, you could say that we have to follow a disciplined curriculum for our learning. As Christians we need to commit ourselves to things like prayer, Bible study, worship, ministry, and fellowship if we are to grow in our understanding of Jesus as well as how we are to live our lives in light of Jesus. Nor is this something we can accomplish in isolation. Instead, Jesus calls us into community where we share in this journey together. We learn from each other as we encourage each other in this process of becoming more like Jesus.

Finally, all of this is dependent upon the Holy Spirit working in our lives. Ultimately our growth in the Christian life is a result of God's Spirit. The transformation that God desires in our lives cannot be accomplished simply in what we do. We can't make ourselves more like Jesus in our own power and work. Rather, only the power and the work of the Holy Spirit can lead us to a fuller life in Christ. We must be willing to listen and learn, to grow and change, and to follow and go where Jesus leads us. The psalmist said it this way,

"Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths.

Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation."

May this by our goal as students of Jesus. Let us be ready to learn and ready to be made new.

Our Divine Stalker

You know how it begins: *The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want.* But are you as familiar with these words that appear near the conclusion of Psalm 23: *Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life?*

The image of God as a shepherd has been around for thousands of years, and for those who believe in the one, true God this image remains a tremendous source of strength and comfort, especially during those times when we walk through dark and lonely valleys. The image of God as a shepherd is a good one, because it conveys certain attributes of God: God goes before us, leading us to safe places where there is sustenance, protection, and comfort. But this is where many of us leave it, with God out in front leading the way.

As we read the Psalms we often find the psalmist crying out for help as he is being hotly pursued by his enemy. In the 23rd Psalm we discover that God is not only out in front leading, but is also pursuing us from behind, not as our enemy, but as our loving God. God is our divine stalker, the one who tirelessly pursues us with goodness and mercy. In God we have the one who leads us like a shepherd leading a flock, and we also have the one who is in constant pursuit, never far behind, continuously offering the benefit of blessing and the gift of loving kindness...all the days of our lives.


