When it comes to the return policy of God one could say it is pretty liberal. As individuals we sometimes wander away from God in our lives. We leave God behind and move on in a direction of our choice. The story of the prodigal son in Luke's gospel illustrates this so well. The youngest of two sons left his father and wasted all that he had on wild living. When he became broke,

homeless, and destitute he decided to go back home.

The son was unsure of how his father would receive him. In fact, he never considered going back to life as it used to be. He would be happy just being a servant in his father's household. Yet, as Jesus tells the story, the Father received his wayward son with joy and enthusiasm. Forgiveness was the father's return policy and he showered it on his son. His son had returned and that was all that mattered.

Jesus told this story to illustrate the return policy of God for all who sin and wander away from God. Regardless of the distance we create between ourselves and God, God is always willing to receive us back. God will not turn away any sinner who repents and returns to him. Rather, like the Father in the story, God receives us with joy.

The return policy of God as we begin 2013 is the same as it has always been. It simply says, "Come home." As we begin this year let us remember God's return policy and grand invitation. There is no other one like it. In fact, returns are what God does best.
