Does the name Edmund Burke mean anything to you? Perhaps not. He was an Irish statesman, author, orator, political theorist and philosopher, who, after moving to England, served for many years in the House of Commons of Great Britain as a member of the Whig party. He is mainly remembered for his support of the cause of the American Revolutionaries. Burke was praised by both conservatives and liberals in the 19th century, and since then he has generally been viewed as the philosophical founder of modern conservatism, as well as a representative of classical liberalism.

Even if you don't recognize his name, you will probably recognize some of the things he said. This month I am asking you to do more than read. Below you will find some quotes of Edmund Burke. Read them, yes, but also give some thought as to how these words can be applied to your Christian discipleship.

“The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing.”

“Nobody made a greater mistake than he who did nothing because he could do only a little.”

“Our patience will achieve more than our force.”

“Whoever undertakes to set himself up as a judge of Truth and Knowledge is shipwrecked by the laughter of the Gods.”

“Liberty does not exist in the absence of morality.”

“Men are qualified for civil liberty in exact proportion to their disposition to put moral chains upon their appetites.”

“Whenever a separation is made between liberty and justice, neither, in my opinion, is safe.”

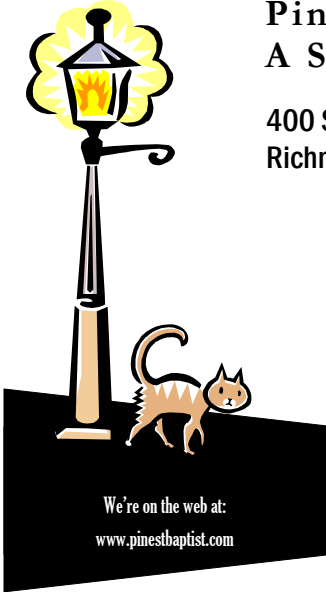

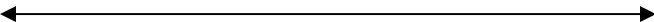
