


Twice a month for years now, Pine Street has offered outdoor movies for the community of Oregon Hill. Pleasants Park behind the church has provided a great location for this important ministry. At our most recent movie night I found myself looking out at the people who had gathered for the feature presentation. It was quite a diverse gathering. A great number of those attending were our homeless neighbors. The Friday night movies have become a favorite event for many of them. They enjoy the food and the fellowship. Likewise, several always arrive early to help us set up everything for the night. At our last movie, one of the men shared with me his gratitude for the movie and the food, but more so just for an opportunity for a few hours to forget that he lived on the streets.

At the movies you will also find a number of children who have come with their families. These children usually end up playing at the other end of Pleasants Park while the movie is playing. They come back and forth to the refreshments throughout the night, especially when snow cones are being served. Moms and dads spread out blankets and set up chairs to watch the movie as well.

Intermingled in the Friday night crowd will be some of our college students who will drift in and out as the night goes on. They especially enjoy the free food that is offered to the movie goers. Sitting among the crowd will be a committed group of Pine Streeters who come out to each movie, help set up and take down, serve the food, fellowship with the others there, and are a visible presence of the church in the community.

Finally, as I looked out over the crowd of people I saw men and women, boys and girls, black and white, young and old. It made me think that the people gathered is a good reflection of what the Kingdom of God looks like. I realized that I was watching more than a movie, but I was seeing how God has taken his ministry to bring our community together.

If you have never been to one of our Friday night movies I encourage you to take in a feature during August. August 16 and August 30 will be our movie nights this month. Yet, you will see more than a movie, you will see a community gathered together and Pine Street Church right in the middle of it all. Church doesn't just happen at 11:00 on Sunday mornings, it also gathers on Friday nights in an open field.

Clint's Corner

Along the Way

In her book **Fumbling**, Kerry Egan documents her journey as she traveled from the Pyrenees in southern France through the valleys of Navarre and westward through Spain to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. At age twenty-five, Egan took this pilgrimage just a year after the death of her father, and while she was a student at Harvard Divinity School. It was through walking eight or ten hours a day that she first began to understand what grief really was and to recognize God's presence in everyday people and places.

A few years prior to her pilgrimage, Egan was in an accident, and had not been expected to live. But she did, against all odds and against all predictions. Besides dealing with her grief, Kegan saw the pilgrimage as her way of saying thank you, of giving back whatever she could to whomever she could in order to thank whatever it was that gave her the chance to live. As she walked, Egan helped people along the way – wrapping ankles, splinting knees, removing splinters, or tending blisters. She only had so much time to finish the journey, but suddenly finishing didn't seem so important. Walking was important, and being available to whom-ever might need a nurse along the remote and isolated parts of the route.

We are all on a journey. We are all on the way to some destination. We often walk through life moving from one location to another as quickly as we can – “I’m sorry. I don’t have time. I must get to...” With our eyes clearly focused on the goal, we easily miss the opportunities God places before us. As we take our own walks through this life, as we walk the Christian pilgrimage, let us be mindful that there are people to help along the way. After all, it is their journey too.


