Much time has passed since Jesus spoke these words, but they are still as important today in our Christian walk. We must live each day as if this was the Day of the Lord, as well as his return. Such awareness should lead us to live lives of righteousness and holiness. We need to be individually ready for his coming. Likewise, as we live in the world we should be living lives of compassion towards others. Every day gives us an opportunity to share God's love with others.

So we ask, "Are you ready for the Lord?" How we answer this question will make all the difference in how we live.

Among life's challenges, Paul teaches that God is faithful, and God will "provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it." A door is open to us, a door to prayer that leads to warmth, light, calm, and beauty, and we really don't even need to knock. All we really need to do is walk on through.


