How would you define stewardship? Stewardship is another way of talking about ministry, and it would revolutionize ministry if people could think of it in terms of stewardship—that we are accountable to God for what we do and with what he has trusted to us.

The word stewardship comes from the Greek word *oikenomous*, which means somebody who manages a household. A person doesn't own the household but manages it. And stewards in the ancient world, of course, were trusted with everything from seeing that the floors were clean, to the finances, to the public face of that household. We are not the owners but have been trusted with resources and the care of everything creation, gifts and talents, money, time, the gospel—for the sake of God's purposes in the world.



As we begin a new church year each of us must reflect on how we will live out our stewardship in the coming year. We must each consider how we will care for everything that God has entrusted to us as Christians and as members of Pine Street Baptist. We should understand that our entire lives are to be an offering to God. Stewardship is more that just the pocketbook although that is an important part of Christian stewardship. Financially we do offer back to God a portion of what God has blessed us with. In the Bible this is called a tithe and was considered to be 10% of one's wealth. When we give back to God through our offering we are saying in our giving that we trust in God to care for us more than the wealth we possess.

As members of the church we are also called to give of our talents. Every person has been blessed by God with abilities. Each person is different and gifted in their own way. As Christian stewards we must seek to discover how we can use our giftedness to further God's Kingdom in the world. The church is a collection of individual talents that are joined together to carry out God's work in the world. Every person has a talent and every person has been called to use that talent. Serving God and serving others combine to give us a complete and full Christian experience.

Finally, we are called to give of our time. Time is a precious commodity because time is limited. We are only on this earth for a certain amount of time. How we use that time is a question of stewardship. In each 24 hour day we should ask ourselves how we can use the gift of that day to the glory of God. How do I spend my time, with whom do I spend my time, and where do I spend my time are good questions to consider as Christians and as the church.

Tithes, talents, and time are the trifecta of Christian stewardship. Each one is important to faithfully caring for everything that God has entrusted us with. Christian stewardship is as important as Christian worship. Any of stewardship is really an act of worship of God. Thus, may we each faithfully worship, serve, and give as we begin a new year as Pine Street Baptist Church.
